- Deadline to submit Registration Form B to avoid higher registration fees.

GlobalFest

Description of Activities

Arts and Crafts Students may display original work in a wide variety of formats—scrapbooks, drawings, paintings, fabric-based crafts, mixed-media fine art, instruments, photography, models, paper crafts, piñatas. Schools may submit entries for the GlobalFest Banner and poster. Artwork will be displayed and entered in a “People’s Choice” competition; awards presented at Closing Ceremony. To submit items for display, please see the Guidelines (page 8) and complete Forms E and F.

Discovery Rooms Led by students, teachers, international experts and organizations, these interactive sessions include an enormous variety of fun and interesting cultural activities relating to world languages and cultures. Participants learn about regional traditions, international issues and careers; make replicas of cultural artifacts, learn songs, hear stories and play games in world languages, and more. Each participating school is encouraged to organize a Discovery Room activity – it is a great leadership opportunity for students! *Please note: Cooking demonstrations are not possible at Normal Community West High School.*

Exhibits Merchants, organizations, and school groups offer a wide variety of items to explore or purchase, such as candy, food, crafts, keepsakes, and trinkets from world regions, T-shirts in world languages, interactive activities, and displays about world regions and issues. Participating school clubs are encouraged to develop displays about world issues, demonstrate cultural activities, or sell pre-packaged regional foods at exhibit tables.

Global Connections Quiz Bowl In this single-elimination competition, three-student teams work together to answer questions on history, current events, world personalities, geography, language & culture, and global issues. The competition is held Friday evening. Schools may enter more than one team; however, a different teacher must accompany each team. The rules for “The Global Connections” are not the same as IHSA Scholastic Bowl rules; your participation in this event will not affect your IHSA standing. Awards are presented at the Closing Ceremony. To register to participate, please submit Activity Participation Form A by Jan. 18.

GlobalFest Crazy Olympiques Events like the Three-legged Race offer a fun and interactive way to make new friends from other schools. Medals will be awarded for each event in a dubiously dignified ceremony.

Language Immersion Rooms Basic vocabulary, alphabets, scripts, and linguistic practices of almost two dozen less commonly taught languages are introduced in Language Immersion Rooms. Classes are led by trained instructors or natives of the country.

Parade of Schools and Cultures Schools are invited to join the GlobalFest Opening Ceremony by parading their school banner, and if desired, wearing clothing representing world heritages, and carrying national or regional flags. Rotary International exchange students will carry flags representing their country of origin. To participate, please submit Activity Participation Form A by Jan. 18

Performances Students present skits, songs, and dances to an audience of their peers: whether a soloist singing a Mozart aria, or groups performing folk dances, displaying drumming skills, lip-syncing to a Latin American hit, or performing a French skit, performances provide students an opportunity to display their skills with world languages and cultures. Performances are from 5 to 30 minutes. Accompanying music must be provided on CD and turned in upon arrival at GlobalFest. Recognition awards are presented at the Closing Ceremony. To participate, please submit Activity Participation Form A by Jan. 18

Closing Ceremony The final event of GlobalFest includes presentations of awards and an international cultural performance.

Responsibilities of Teachers and Chaperones

What to do in advance

Registration

To attend GlobalFest, you must pre-register using forms in this packet or online. **Sorry, no on-site registrations can be accepted.** The designated contact person for your group will receive advance materials by mail including check-in procedures, parking information, the program, and information about Discovery Rooms, Performances, Global Connections Quiz Bowl, and Exhibits organized by your students or school. Please bring these materials with you and review them in advance with your students, teachers, and chaperones to ensure your GlobalFest experience is enjoyable.

Travel and Lodging

School groups are responsible for making their own travel and lodging arrangements. Small travel grants may be available to schools. To apply, please check appropriate box on registration form. A list of hotels/motels in the Bloomington/Normal area is located on the following page. Blocks of rooms at several hotels have been reserved at a discounted rate for GlobalFest participants. Please note: GlobalFest does not assume responsibility or liability for the supervision or safety of students lodged in these facilities.

What to expect at GlobalFest

We recommend you hold at least one orientation meeting with your students prior to coming to GlobalFest. Students who are fully informed about their roles as participants in GlobalFest and aware of expectations will benefit the most from their GlobalFest experience.

Encourage students to

- participate in as many different activities as possible
- arrive punctually for activities and performances, especially if they are organizers or performers
- recognize that seating may sometimes be limited, and they may need to select an alternate session
- be respectful of people of different nationalities and cultures than their own
- appreciate the efforts of volunteers, presenters, performers, and staff participating in GlobalFest
- follow the same standards of behavior, dress, language, and courtesy of a normal school day
- stay inside the school and respectful of the school building and equipment
- actively engage in activities, rather than roam the halls or sit around idly
- keep track of personal items; GlobalFest cannot assume responsibility for lost or stolen property

Registration Check-in

Check-in will be located at the entrance on the North side of the school. You will be asked to submit the required forms (we recommend keeping photocopies of these forms for your records):

- Form D List of Participants *Schools must have at least one adult supervisor for each fifteen students.*
- Form C Medical/Publicity Release Form. One for each participant, including chaperones and teachers. *No one will be permitted to attend GlobalFest without submitting this completed form.*
- Performers: Please turn in CD of music for your performance at check-in.

Registration packets

Each registered school group will receive a packet that contains items need by each participant:
GlobalFest Buttons -- to be worn at all times during GlobalFest
GlobalFest Passport – students collect stamps after each activity in which they participate
GlobalFest Programs -- Schedule of Activities

Supervision and On-site Assistance

Teachers and chaperones are responsible for supervising their own students during GlobalFest. All teachers and chaperones whose schools are not offering an activity listed on the GlobalFest Program, are requested to volunteer one hour during GlobalFest. Sign up for these duties will be done at the check-in registration desk when you first arrive with scheduling being done on a first come, first served basis. We suggest leaving coats and personal items in your bus or vehicle, rather than bringing them into the building.

Global Connections Quiz Bowl Guidelines

This is a single-elimination competition in which teams of students respond to questions on history, current events, world personalities, geography, language and culture, and global issues. Students in grades nine through twelve are eligible to participate. Questions are posed in English.

The rules for the *Global Connections Quiz Bowl* are not the same as IHSA Scholastic Bowl rules; your participation in this event will not affect your IHSA standing. Once you are registered, you will receive a copy of the rules and guidelines developed by the GlobalFest committee.

Each school may register more than one three-student team; however, each team must be accompanied by a different teacher. Substitutions on the team are allowed only prior to the first competition, once competition has begun, no further substitutions will be allowed. We recommend selecting one or more additional students to train with the team as coaches and alternates in case you need a last minute substitute. If you register a team, please try to bring a team since cancellations leave other teams without a competitor.

Global Connections Quiz Bowl is held on Friday evening of GlobalFest. Preliminary rounds begin at 6:00 PM. Final rounds finish by 8:30 PM. Awards are presented at the Closing Ceremonies on Saturday. A plaque with the name of the winning high team will also be engraved and placed on display at the school hosting GlobalFest.

To register a team, each teacher must submit a copy of Form A, marking the appropriate boxes. Then mail it as directed at the bottom of the form, no later than January 18, 2010. Upon receipt of your registration, you will receive further specific instructions by e-mail from the chairperson of "The Global Connections."

Arts and Crafts Guidelines

Arts and Crafts items will be on display in a supervised area during GlobalFest. All entries will be eligible to receive “People’s Choice” awards. Voting information will be provided in the exhibit area.

All arts and craft submissions should have been created since GlobalFest 2009.

All items require a label (see Form F, page 14).

All items should be mounted for display.

Only teachers or chaperones may deliver or reclaim arts and craft entries. All entries must be received by 9:45 AM; and reclaimed between 2:15–2:45 PM on Saturday.

Teachers should complete Form E; two copies of Form E must be submitted with the entries (retain a copy for your records).

A \$1.00 fee is required for entries by students who are not registered for GlobalFest.

Crafts Crafts may be made from kits or from original designs. Please indicate the category and subcategory on the label.

Drawing: charcoal, chalk, pencil, etc.

Painting: watercolor, oil, acrylic, etc.

Fabric-based craft: costume, wall hanging, rug, leather, beadwork

Mixed-media fine art: tin, wax, jewelry, soap carving, pottery, ceramics, mosaics

Instrument: maracas, rain stick, flute, drum, etc.

International Photography: original photos depicting world culture

Model: building, airplane, vehicle, monument, natural sites representing international setting

Paper products: greeting card, origami, flower, paper-maché, etc.

Piñatas: made of paper & cardboard, unfilled

Wood: statues, figurines, carvings

Miscellaneous: other projects

Posters Posters should reflect the theme for this year’s GlobalFest, and feature the words “Cultural Crossroads! GlobalFest 2010”. Posters should measure no more than 24 inches x 36 inches. Limit 10 entries per school.

Scrapbooks Scrapbooks should be based on an international or culturally specific theme, chosen from the following topics, include a minimum of 12 pages, and state the student’s language level (SP1; FR 3; GER 2): Famous personalities, Geographical Locations, Cultural Topics, Global Perspectives (energy, population, environment, etc.)

GlobalFest Banners These decorative banners should reflect the theme for this year’s GlobalFest. Please note: The GlobalFest Banner is not for the Opening Ceremonies Parade of Schools. The winning banners will be presented at the closing ceremonies. Limit 1 entry per school.

Specifications:

Dimensions: 2 ½ feet deep x 6 feet wide.

Construct using a durable fabric (not paper, wood, or metal). If glue is used, it should be fabric glue.

Decorate one side only.

Feature the slogan “Cultural Crossroads! GlobalFest 2010” and include the GlobalFest logo.

Provide a top hem, through which a 12-foot length of clothesline is threaded. The clothesline should extend three feet on either side of the banner, to allow the banner to be displayed.
